MEETING MINUTES NEVADA COMMISSION for the RECONSTRUCTION of the V&T Railway WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2020, 1 p.m. Via Zoom

The following minutes are a summarized explanation of the topics discussed. The minutes were prepared from notes taken by Elaine Barkdull-Spencer due to online ZOOM conferencing limitations and no recording of the meeting is available.

SPECIAL FY19-20 AUDIT MEETING

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order. 1: 02 P.M.

- 2. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA
- D. Peterson made a motion to approve the agenda as submitted.

3. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON-AGENDIZED ITEMS

No Public Comment.

- 4. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE V&T RAILWAY AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2020 COMPLETED BY STEELE & ASSOCIATES.
- E. Spencer introduced Vanessa Davis with Steele & Associates and turned the discussion over to her.

V. Davis used the draft version of the FY19-20 Financial Statements to present the audit findings. She indicated that the audit resulted in an unmodified clean opinion.

The net position of the V&T Railway financials had decreased by \$634,543 during the fiscal year. Depreciation expense of \$777,113 was the largest cause of the decrease in net position.

V&T's operating revenue had decreased \$85,843 from the prior year. This was due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the cancellation of the May and June 2020 train rides. These rides were projected to result in an additional \$125,000 in revenue and included the popular Mother's Day rides. Contributions from governments, in the amount of \$388,630, was less than the prior year due to a deferred request for funding. Expenses decreased by \$98,582 from the prior year. The main reason was extensive cutbacks made by the general manager in all expenses during the COVID-19 shutdown, and again after the May and June train rides were cancelled.

E. Spencer stated that an augmented FY19-20 was approved by the Department of Taxation in June 2020.

The Commission's capital assets amounted to \$37,819,203, with accumulated depreciation of \$8,005,049, leaving net book value of \$29,814,154. An additional \$81,388 in work in process for ongoing repairs to the #18 train engine was incurred during the year.

Forecasting revenue for FY2021 is difficult due to the prolonged Coronavirus Pandemic. The commission expects an unpredictable 2021 train season and will submit an augmented FY2021 budget if necessary.

The NRS required that government funding budgetary controls be exercised at the function level. For the year ended June 30, 2020, total expenditures exceeded appropriations for potential violations of the NRS were Marketing expenses \$22,356 much of this was for expenses that overlapped the previous fiscal year. Repairs and maintenance in the amount of \$6,877 and were overlap expenses and invoices submitted for work performed the previous fiscal year. Services and supplies exceeded the budget by \$63,996 and was a large sum under Miscellaneous that were not identified in more detail during the TYLER transfer period.

- D. Peterson identified grammatical errors of which V. Davis agreed to correct.
- E. Spencer requested the merchandise income be increased to the gross amount as it is represented in the budget, or the COGS be evaluated, and the net be represented as revenue.
- D. Dotson motioned that the draft FY2020 audit be approved with the recommended adjustment and changes made. Second M. McBride

4. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

It was noted that the date for the September 2020 meeting was listed as September 27 and it was September 24. D. Peterson noted that his last name was spelled incorrectly and should be spelled Peterson, not Petersen. He also noted that he was listed as Treasurer instead of Deny Dotson.

D. Peterson made a motion to approve the minutes with recommended changes.

- 5. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: DISCUSS AND ACCEPT THE RESIGNATION OF NICK MARANO AS THE V&T RAILWAY COMMMISSIONER REPRESENTING THE CITY OF CARSON CITY
- S. Jones explained that N. Marano had taken a town manager's position in Florida and had moved.
- E. Spencer had contacted Carson City and they were considering his replacement.
- D. Peterson made a motion to approve Nick Marano's resignation from the V&T Railway Commission as the representative for Carson City's seat.

6. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: FY21 FINANCIAL REPORTS

- D. Dotson turned the topic over to E. Spencer for details on the September and October reports. E. Spencer explained that the report did not require approval as there were corrections that were yet to be made by the Storey County Comptroller for September's report and the October Budget Report did not include the revenue for that month.
- E. Spencer explained that the Ticket Refunds listed on the September Budget Report was to be offset by deferred Polar Express tickets from FY20 and did not belong in the FY21 expenses. The refunds were a result of tickets purchased for Polar Express 2020 that was cancelled due to COVID and were refunded in September. The expense was to be debited from the deferred income balance. Revenue-to-date ending, September 30, 2020, was \$396,902.68. Expenses were \$135,485.36.
- E. Spencer explained that the October Budget Report had not been corrected and listed \$16,916.09 in ticket refunds and it would be debited instead from Deferred Ticket Revenue. The October Budget Report did not include that month's deposits and she showed a copy of October's bank reconciliation that included \$99,938.35 in deposits. Revenue-to-date, October 31, 2020, was \$496,841.03 and expenses were \$284,822.71.
- E. Spencer explained that FY21 would require an Augmented Budget to be submitted due to the pandemic's continued impact on train rides and the cancellation of FY21 Polar Express Season (2020). She said the two alternative events, Family Fun Packages and Santa's Drive Thru would be listed as special events and Polar Express and possibly May and June 2021's trains would not run. The revenue and expenses would need to be augmented.
 - 7. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: UPDATE ON THE CARSON

CANYON RAILBIKES OPERATION

E. Spencer reported that the following weekend would be the last weekend for railbikes, and it was a Railbike and Hike event. She reported that the half season, beginning August 8th through November thus far had resulted in approximately 4,415 passengers and nearly \$190,000 in revenue which was split 40 – 60 with Freedom Rail. She said that the number of bikes started with six and ended with nine. On average there were six bikes available for each tour. The smoke from the California fires had resulted in several cancellation or gift certificates. Overall though the revenue had beaten expectations and the railbikes turned out to be extremely popular.

M. McBride commented that he was not originally supportive of the railbike option, but ultimately, he voted for it and it turned out to be a good idea.

8. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: UPDATE ON HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND SALES REPORT

E. Spencer reported that the two alternative options relating to the cancelation of the Polar Express, Santa's Drive-Thru Village and the Polar Express Family Fun Gift Packages were both selling well. Santa's Drive-Thru Village was nearing \$10,000 and 400 vouchers. The Family Fun Gift Packages were at \$2,800 and she expected the 150 packages to sell out before Christmas.

D. Dotson explained his own challenges in Virginia City relating to hosting events and recommended contacting the State relating to the new COVID-19 compliance directives. E. Spencer said she had contacted Carson City Manager Nancy Poulsen and she was good with the plan and its event COVID compliant procedures and understood it was up to the counties to approve events. Mike Draper with Argentum Partners offered to contact Caleb Cage with the Governor's COVID Taskforce to determine if a special event compliance permit was required. E. Spencer thanked both D. Dotson and M. Draper and committed to following up.

9. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: MARKETING UPDATE Molly Ellery and Mike Draper attended. Molly recapped September and October's website activities and ad data. She

She presented Eblasts created for the Railbike Spooky Rides and Santa's Drive Thru numbers. Earned media included several media venues and they had arranged for both Channel 4 and Channel 8 TV stations to interview Elaine Spencer. M. Ellery's presentation was shown via ZOOM display.

10. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: PROGRESS REPORT ON THE ENGINE #18 OVERHAUL AND PURCHASE ORDERS FOR PROJECTS OVER \$5,000

E. Spencer read an email from Tom Gray in his absence which read,

'Basically, we have done several steam trials and repaired the corresponding punch lists. We have winterized the engine. I feel pretty good about it and what is left to do would be a bigger trial down the grade with a heavy load and there are some things like reworking the boiler plugs and tender shut off, some paint and lettering. The tender does need to be replaced but perhaps another year.'

E. Spencer let the board know that there was an invoice included in the board packets for the #18 repairs for \$13,408.33 which was over the \$5,000 and required board approval. She stated that T. Gray had provided the backup documents for the invoice.

M. McBride drew the board's attention to the fact that it was a discussion item only. He suggested approving Virginia & Truckee Railroad's invoice under item 11.

Michael Rowe, V&T Railway's attending legal adviser, confirmed that approving the invoice under item 11 was related and allowable.

11. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING TRACK MAINTENANCE AND PURCHASE ORDERS FOR PROJECTS OVER \$5,000

M. McBride made a motion to approve Virginia & Truckee's invoice for \$13,408.33.

Second - D. Dotson

Approved – Unanimously

Gabe Willaman reported via ZOOM that he is planning to put preemergent chemical down and clean out some of the ditches. He said that the bridge inspection was finished.

E. Spencer said that the inspector would be attending the January meeting and would present his findings and that G. Willaman would update his maintenance schedule for the commission after the finding were presented.

12. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

- E. Spencer reported that V&T had received two of the FEMA grant reimbursements and there should be a third. She said they had asked for more information relating to the reimbursement requests and that Ken Dorr had assisted her in tracking down the information. She estimates approximately \$16,000 will be received.
- E. Spencer reported that she had submitted four State Tourism Grants and had two approved. One was for a Fall & Winter social media campaign for \$9,710. The other was for a state tourism VIP grant for passenger loading areas for the railbikes and had been approved for \$6,952.
- 13. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: ATTORNEY'S REPORT M. Rowe stated it had been slow and he had worked with E. Spencer on the Request for Public Information by Kim Fegert and answered a few questions she had emailed.

14. CHAIRMAN JONES BROUGHT THE NEXT ITEM TO THE COMMISSION'S ATTENTION: NEXT MEETING DATE(S) & AGENDA ITEMS

SENATE BILL NO. 57-COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

(ON BEHALF OF STOREY COUNTY)

PREFILED NOVEMBER 17, 2016

Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway. (BDR S-414)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: No.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway; removing certain boards of county commissions from the governing bodies of the Commission; revising the membership of the Commission; eliminating authority for the Commission to enter into agreements with the district attorney or treasurer of certain counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway, provides that the governing bodies of the Commission are the Board of Supervisors of Carson City and the Boards of County Commissioners of Douglas, Lyon, Storey and Washoe counties and authorizes each of those counties to appoint a representative to the Commission. (Sections 1-3 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993) Section 1 of this bill removes the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas, Lyon and Washoe counties from the governing bodies of the Commission. Section 2 of this bill makes conforming changes.

Section 3 of this bill revises the composition of the Commission to: (1) remove the commissioners appointed by Douglas, Lyon and Washoe counties, the Virginia and Truckee Historical Railroad Society, the Speaker of the Assembly and the Senate Majority Leader; and (2) authorize the Carson City Convention and Visitors Bureau and the Virginia City Tourism Commission to each appoint a member to the Commission. Section 4 of this bill makes conforming changes.

Section 7 of this bill provides that the terms of the Commissioners who have been removed expire on October 1, 2017.





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Under existing law, each governing body of the Commission is required to provide funding for the Commission's budget that is based on the benefit of the Commission or reconstruction of the V & T Railway to the jurisdiction of the governing body. Existing law also authorizes each governing body to issue bonds and impose certain taxes in order to fund its portion of the Commission's budget. (Section 9 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993) Because **section 1** removes the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas, Lyon and Washoe Counties from the governing bodies of the Commission, those counties will no longer have to fund any portion of the Commission's budget. However, if any of those counties have issued bonds to fund its share of the Commission's budget before October 1, 2017, **section 8** of this bill provides that the provisions of this bill do not apply to impair any existing bond or bond obligations.

Existing law authorizes the Commission to enter into an agreement with the district attorney of Carson City, or Douglas, Lyon, Storey or Washoe County to provide legal services to the Commission. Existing law also authorizes the Commission to enter into an agreement with the treasurer of any of those counties to create a fund and pay all claims that are approved by the Commission. (Section 8 of the V & T Railway Act of 1993) Section 5 of this bill eliminates the authority to enter into an agreement with the district attorney or Treasurer of Douglas, Lyon and Washoe counties. Section 6 makes a conforming change. Section 9 of this bill terminates on October 1, 2017, any agreement entered into by the Commission with a district attorney or the Treasurer of Douglas, Lyon or Washoe County.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 1 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, being chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, as amended by chapter 42, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 400, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise requires:

- 1. "Commission" means the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway created pursuant to section 2 of this act.
- 2. "Commissioner" means a person [appointed to serve] who serves on the Commission pursuant to section 3 of this act.
 - 3. "County" includes Carson City.
- 4. "Governing bodies" means the Board of Supervisors of Carson City and the [Boards] Board of County Commissioners of [Douglas, Lyon,] Storey [and Washoe counties.] County.



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- Sec. 2. Section 2 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, being chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, as amended by chapter 42, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 400, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - Sec. 2. 1. The Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway of Carson City and [Douglas, Lyon,] Storey [and Washoe counties] County is hereby created.
 - 2. The property and revenues of the Commission, and any interest therein, are exempt from all state and local taxation.
 - 3. The Commission is a body corporate and politic, the geographical jurisdiction of which is Carson City and Douglas, Lyon, Storey [and Washoe counties.] County.
 - 4. The provisions of this act must be broadly construed to accomplish its purposes.
- Sec. 3. Section 3 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, being chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, as amended by chapter 42, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 400, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - Sec. 3. 1. The Commission must be composed of **[nine]** five Commissioners **[appointed]** as follows:
 - (a) One member [who is a member of] appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Carson City [appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Carson City;] from among its members or who is an employee of Carson City;
 - (b) One member appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County from among its members;

 (c) One member appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Lyon County from among its members;
 - (d) One member appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Storey County from among its members \(\frac{1}{2}\);
 - (e) One member appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County from among its members;
 - (f) One member appointed by the Virginia and Truckee Historical Railroad Society from among its members;
 - (g) One member appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly;
 - (h) One member appointed by the Senate Majority Leader; and
 - —(i) or who is an employee of Storey County;
 - (c) One member who is the Executive Director, or the person holding an equivalent position, of the Carson City Convention and Visitors Bureau who serves as an ex officio member of the Commission;



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(d) One member who is the Executive Director, or the person holding an equivalent position, of the Virginia City Tourism Commission who serves as an ex officio member of the Commission; and

(e) One member appointed by the Governor.

2. [If the Virginia and Truckee Historical Railroad Society ceases to exist but is replaced by an entity which is organized for the same purposes, that entity is entitled to appoint the member pursuant to paragraph (f) of subsection 1. If the society ceases to exist and is not replaced, the number of commissioners is reduced to eight and no member may be appointed pursuant to paragraph (f) of subsection 1.

3. The terms of the two members serving on the Commission pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1 on July 1, 2001, expire on that date.] As soon as practicable after [July 1, 2001,] October 1, 2017, the appointing authorities shall make any appointments required by subsection 1. All of the appointments must be for initial terms of 1, 2 or 3 years to ensure staggered terms. After the initial terms, the term of office of each appointed commissioner is 4 years. A member is eligible for reappointment.

[4.] 3. The office of a member who is required as a qualification for appointment to be a member of the body appointing the member or an employee of a county becomes vacant on the date he or she ceases to be a member of that appointing body [-

—5. or an employee of that county.

4. Each appointed commissioner serves at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority, and all vacancies must be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

Sec. 4. Section 4 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, being chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, as last amended by chapter 98, Statutes of Nevada 2013, at page 339, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4. 1. [Each] The commissioner appointed pursuant to paragraph (b) [, (c), (d) or (e)] or (d) of subsection 1 of section 3 of this act shall file his or her oath of office with the county clerk of [the county from which the commissioner was appointed,] Storey County, and all other commissioners shall file their oaths of office with the Clerk of Carson City.



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2. The commissioners must serve without compensation, but a commissioner may be reimbursed for expenses actually incurred for travel authorized by the Commission.

3. The Commission shall elect a Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer from among its members. The Secretary and the Treasurer may be one person. The terms of the officers expire on July 1 of each odd-numbered year.

- 4. The Secretary shall maintain audio recordings or transcripts of all meetings of the Commission and a record of all of the proceedings of the Commission, minutes of all meetings, certificates, contracts and other acts of the Commission. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 241.035, the records must be open to the inspection of all interested persons at a reasonable time and place. A copy of the minutes or audio recordings must be made available to a member of the public upon request at no charge pursuant to NRS 241.035.
- 5. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all money received by and disbursed on behalf of the Commission. The Treasurer shall file with the Clerk of Carson City, at the expense of the Commission, a fidelity bond in an amount not less than \$10,000, conditioned for the faithful performance of his or her duties.

Sec. 5. Section 8 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, being chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, as last amended by chapter 99, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 586, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 8. 1. The Commission may enter into an agreement with the district attorney of Carson City or [Douglas, Lyon,] Storey [or Washoe] County, or [any combination thereof,] both, to provide legal services to the Commission. The Commission may authorize payment to the district attorney for the costs to the district attorney for providing those services.
- 2. The Commission shall enter into an agreement with the Treasurer of Carson City or [Douglas, Lyon,] Storey [or Washoe] County to create a fund for the Commission and pay all claims against the fund that are properly approved by the Commission. The Commission may authorize payment to the Treasurer for the costs to the Treasurer for providing those services.
- 3. All money received by the Commission must be deposited in the fund created pursuant to subsection 2. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.37945, the money in the





fund must be used only for the necessary expenses of the Commission and the costs of the projects authorized by this act.

Sec. 6. NRS 482.37945 is hereby amended to read as follows: 482.37945 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Department, in cooperation with the Northern Nevada Railway Foundation or its successor, shall design, prepare and issue license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad using any colors that the Department deems appropriate. The design of the license plates must include a depiction of a locomotive of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad and the phrase "The Virginia & Truckee Lives." The Department shall not design, prepare or issue the license plates unless it receives at least 250 applications for the issuance of those plates.

If the Department receives at least 250 applications for the issuance of license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad, the Department shall issue those plates for a passenger car or light commercial vehicle upon application by a person who is entitled to license plates pursuant to NRS 482.265 and who otherwise complies with the requirements for registration and licensing pursuant to this chapter. A person may request that personalized prestige license plates issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 be combined with license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad if that person pays the fees for the personalized prestige license plates in addition to the fees for the license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad pursuant to subsections 3 and 4.

3. The fee for license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad is \$35, in addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes. The license plates are renewable upon the payment of \$10.

4. In addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes and the fee prescribed in subsection 3, a person who requests a set of license plates for the support of the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad must pay for the initial issuance of the plates an additional fee of \$25 and for each renewal of the plates an additional fee of \$20, to be distributed pursuant to subsection 5.



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- 5. The Department shall transmit the fees collected pursuant to subsection 4 to the treasurer with whom the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway of Carson City and [Douglas, Lyon,] Storey [and Washoe Counties] County has entered into an agreement as required by subsection 2 of section 8 of chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, for deposit in the fund created pursuant to that section. The fees transmitted pursuant to this subsection must be used only for the reconstruction, maintenance, improvement and promotion of the Virginia & Truckee Railroad.
- 6. If, during a registration period, the holder of license plates issued pursuant to the provisions of this section disposes of the vehicle to which the plates are affixed, the holder shall:
- (a) Retain the plates and affix them to another vehicle that meets the requirements of this section if the holder pays the fee for the transfer of the registration and any registration fee or governmental services tax due pursuant to NRS 482.399; or
- (b) Within 30 days after removing the plates from the vehicle, return them to the Department.
- Sec. 7. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the terms of the members appointed to the Commission pursuant to section 3 of the Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway Act of 1993, as that section existed on September 30, 2017, expire on October 1, 2017.
- Sec. 8. The provisions of this act do not apply to the extent that the provisions would constitute an impairment of the rights of holders of the bonds or similar obligations issued by the State of Nevada or a political subdivision thereof. If there are any such outstanding bonds or obligations, the State of Nevada and its officers and agencies shall take whatever actions that are deemed necessary to protect the interests of the State and the rights of the holders of the bonds and similar obligations.
- Sec. 9. 1. Any agreement entered into by the Commission pursuant to subsection 1 of section 8 of chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, with the district attorney of Douglas, Lyon or Washoe county to provide legal services to the Commission that is effective on September 30, 2017, is terminated on October 1, 2017.
- 2. Any agreement entered into by the Commission pursuant to subsection 2 of section 8 of chapter 566, Statutes of Nevada 1993, with the Treasurer of Douglas, Lyon or Washoe county to create a fund for the Commission and pay claims against the fund that is effective on September 30, 2017, is terminated on October 1, 2017.

Pursuant to our recent discussion, I am pleased to submit this proposal to provide professional consulting services to the V & T Railway Commission in connection with development of a strategic business plan for the V&T Railway. This letter represents my understanding of the project, my approach and general conditions surrounding my involvement with the project.

Overview

The Nevada Commission for the Reconstruction of the V & T Railway was created by the Nevada State Legislature in 1993 (Chapter 566 of the Nevada Revised Statutes) in order to acquire and build the historic railway used by the Virginia and Truckee Railroad, originally built in 1869, then operate and maintain such railway after its reconstruction.
